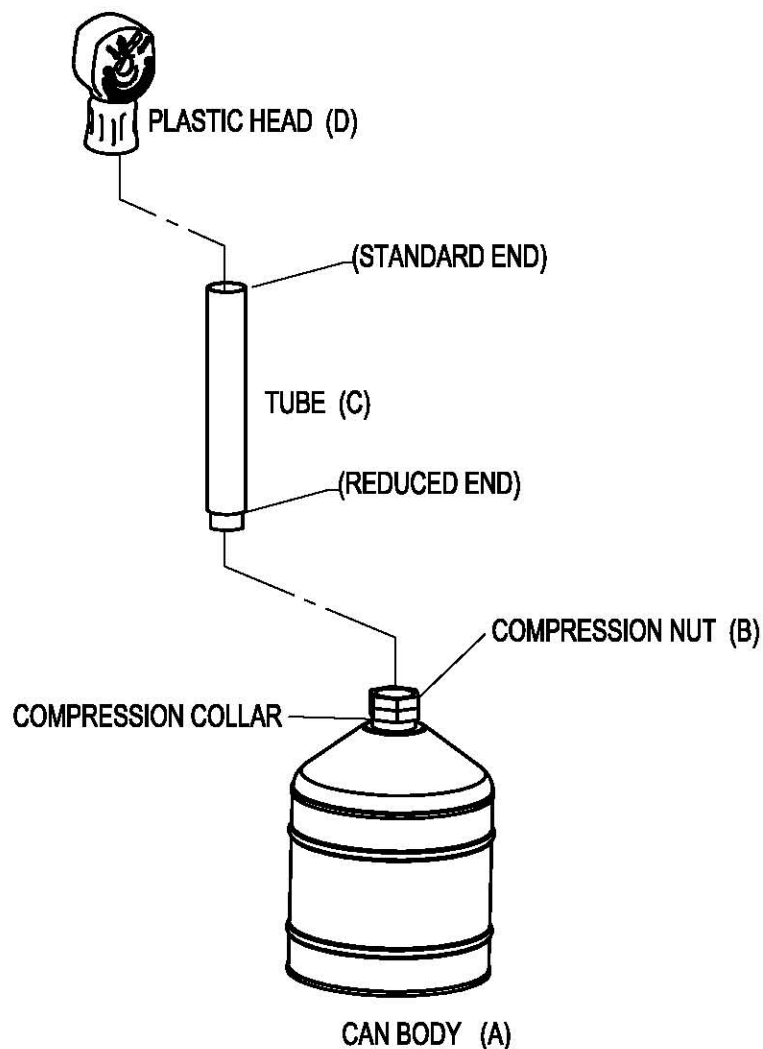




Heavy Duty Butt Can Instructions

The Heavy Duty butt can ASSEMBLY is comprised of; can body, tube, compression collar, and Plastic head. It is easy to use and maintain. Please follow these simple instructions:

1) How to assemble your Heavy Duty Butt Can

We recommend locating the unit close to an outside standing structure.

Loosen the compression nut (B) until tube can easily fit into the compression nut. The tube should fit down to the internal step on the compression collar. When tube is seated turn compress nut clockwise to hand tighten. **Note The reduced end of the tube should be inserted into the compression collar.** Then set the CAN upright to use.

Take Plastic head unit (D) and gently press over standard end of tubing (C). You may need a rubber mallet to do so.

2) To empty cigarette butts from the Heavy Duty Butt Can

Caution: Care should be taken to ensure you are not emptying hot cigarette embers into the trash; this could result in a fire.

Please empty your Heavy Duty Butt Can on a regular basis. Do not let the can body overfill past 75% full.

To remove the waste contents inside of can, Loosen and remove the compression collar nut and tube. You may need to slightly twist the tube to remove it from the compression collar. Empty the contents by turning it upside down and aiming the opening at the refuse container of choice and shake the can until empty.

If you find that the tube is clogged with trash after you empty the can body, remove the plastic head from the tube, and run a rod through the tube. Reinsert the non-painted end of the tube until it seats inside the compression nut and hand tighten the compression nut clockwise. Do not over tighten.

Replace the plastic head to the tube by pressing it on. Then set the unit upright for use.

Caution: Care should be taken to ensure you are not emptying hot cigarette embers into the trash; this could result in a fire.

Note: Optionally to avoid emptying messy and smelly cigarette butts you can discard the Heavy Duty Butt Can and simply replace the entire unit with a new one.

3) General Care

Aesthetically, your new Heavy Duty Butt Can should remain attractive for many years to come.

Use mild dish washing soap and clean as needed. In cases where there is cigarette tar build up you may want to use a multipurpose cleaner, with soft rag and rinse.
